For true Southern hospitality in a charming historic setting, visit Old Town Bluffton.

Near the May River, across the bridge from Hilton Head Island, serenely sits the town of Bluffton.

Old Town Bluffton is filled with a colorful array of shops, galleries, and restaurants in a quaint small-town setting. Take a leisurely stroll around the area and pop into galleries

showcasing locally made sculpture, paintings, pottery, and jewelry. Sneak in some shopping, where the storefronts beckon a bygone era of front porch entrances lined with rocking chairs, flower boxes, and friendly faces. Fuel up at one of the nearby restaurants serving seafood, barbecue, and plenty of fresh and local offerings.

With so much to celebrate, Old Town Bluffton also hosts a variety of special events including Art Walks (three times a year) and the Village Festival (Saturday before Mother's Day). The notable Historic Bluffton Arts & Seafood

Festival (third week of October) is a week-long celebration filled with area arts and culture, and plenty of delicious Lowcountry cuisine (think straight-off-the-boat seafood). Street Fest, the festival's highlight event, features live entertainment, food from local premier restaurants, and juried artwork on display from more than 95 artists.

The fun continues every Thursday (March through December) at The Farmers Market Bluffton in historic downtown (along Calhoun and Lawrence streets). Come out to the market and browse fresh, local produce, fruits, flowers, plants, and more. Enjoy live entertainment while munching on delicious food and chatting with the farmers. Farmers Market Bluffton is a community gathering and a locals' favorite.
