Silver Dew Pottery Magic in Mud



Colorful pots line the shelves at Silver Dew Pottery. Bowls, mugs, platters, teapots, and more are all handmade by Lancy Burn and his wife, Emily. Each pot starts as a humble lump of soft, fresh clay, which is then dried and fired at their studio on Daufuskie Island. Lancy works on the wheel, while Emily rolls out slabs of clay and drapes them in or over molds. Both produce beautiful serving, eating, and drinking ware, as well as purely aesthetic pieces. Lancy and Emily have been in business since 1997 and have been featured in *Water's Edge*, *Southern Living*, and other publications. Inspired by Daufuskie's beautiful island atmosphere, each pot is a unique, handcrafted keepsake from the Lowcountry.
